Prince Chichibu Memorial Park (Putting on Kimono, Tea Ceremony Experience Class and so on)
Since the Second World War, His Imperial Highness Prince Chichibu Yasuhiro and Her Imperial Highness Princess Setsuko had lived in the palace here. After Prince Yasuhiro had passed away, Princess Setsuko had continued to protect the Imperial Family. Then, this palace was donated to Gotemba City with Princess Setsuko's will. The palace has become Prince Chichibu Memorial Park since April 2003. Visitors can enjoy flowers for all four seasons in the park.

Special Needs Center "Fugaku No Sato - Fugaku Taiko Drum Palace" (Taiko Activity)
Outline of the facility: Support for persons in residential care as well as care for daily life in the daytime. It conducts production activity, life support and leisure activity including art in order to meet different individual needs for the sake of contributing to the local community.

Fugaku-Taiko (Taiko Activity): Fugaku-Taiko was established in 1977 when the Chairperson of Social Welfare Corporation "Fugaku-kai" focused on Taiko Drum as a therapy for intellectual disabilities. Fugaku Taiko Drum Palace is a center for rehabilitation called "Fugaku-kai Fugaku no Sono" where there is a unique development program using Taiko Drum as a therapeutic rehabilitation for intellectual disabilities. Fugaku Taiko Drum is effective mentally as well as physically. Today, this rehabilitation is utilized not merely for becoming socially independent but also for cultural and artistic activity by the handicapped, sound upbringing of youth, human resource development. The workshops are held more than 100 times per year, and grab foreigners' attention owing to 25 stages, in 19 countries.

Oyama High School: It cherishes the connections between natural environment around the school and the people living here, and has not only full-time course but also part-time course (night school) with Gotemba Special School on Oyama Campus where it provides barrier-free facilities.

Gotemba Elementary School: A large school that has few thousands of pupils.

Koyama Fukusei Hospital: In 1889, the hospital was established as Japan's first rest home for Hansen's disease sufferers and still operates. Moreover, in 2002, it opened hospice and new medical ward.
